Need more things to do in ham radio during 2015?

There is always something else you can do in amateur radio. I love how the multi-faceted aspects of our hobby and public service always provoke so many thoughts for spending my time and money.

But perhaps you didn't have much time for amateur radio in 2015 until now. You are in luck: there are still plenty of ham radio activities between now and New Year's Day.

Here, in no particular order, are things you can still do in 2015:

- 1. Participate in public service events. Our biggest public service event of the year is the Palos Verdes Half Marathon on Saturday, Nov. 14. Please consider being one of our operators there. You can never be too prepared for radio operating in the field.
- 2. Renew your ARRL membership by December 31, 2015. The ARRL is increasing annual membership dues from \$39 to \$49, effective January 1, 2016. But you can renew or extend your ARRL annual membership for up to three additional years at the current \$39 annual rate by December 31.
- 3. Think now about ham radio holiday gifts to give yourself. Ham radio stores usually have great sales on Thanksgiving Weekend, especially for transceivers of all types.
- 4. Consider upgrading your license class. Our Walt Ordway, K1DFO, starts his next round of two-Saturday ham radio license classes at Hesse Park on Saturday, Oct. 24. If you need more flexibility for ham license instruction consider HamTestOnline.com. This firm has a computerized approach that tracks the areas you need help in and offers individualized guidance/test questions in those categories. The Technician license class costs \$24.95; the General class costs \$29.95; and the Extra class costs \$34.95—each for a two-year period and with a money-back guarantee if you do not pass your test.
- 5. Get your equipment ready for El Niño weather. Heavy rains are expected to start soon; antenna seal tape will keep water out of coax connectors. Ensure your external antennas have some lightning protection too.
- 6. Consider some non-traditional sources for amateur radio equipment. Besides the usual ham radio stores it's interesting how Amazon.com and other non-ham online retailers are now selling many of the lower-cost Chinese brands like TYT, AnyTone, Baofeng (now Pofung), and sometimes Wouxun. Be careful what you order, however, because these brands often use the same model number for units operating on different bands—and quality varies.
- 7. If you are into DXing, but out of touch with it lately, get your equipment ready for several major (and costly) DXpeditions to rare places. A large team will be operating from South Georgia and South Sandwich Islands in the far southern Atlantic Ocean during January-February 2016; another team is operating from the rare Heard Island in the far southern Indian Ocean from March 6-April 20, 2016; and another team heads to rare Palmyra Atoll in the South Pacific during January 11-26, 2016.

Well, I'm out of space here—and I just got started. But feel free to contact me if you need more radio activities to consider during the remainder of 2015. ■

Planning for our next IOTA DXpedition to Catalina

The PVARC has enjoyed many annual mini-DXpeditions to Santa Catalina Island...and these have been a source of great camaraderie.

We are now starting planning for our 2016 DXpedition to Two Harbors but considering some changes from recent years.

First, if meteorological predictions for a major El Niño winter hold true there could be substantial storms during late February (when we've gone to Catalina Island each year since 2010.) We are now looking at possibilities during March or April before our campground area starts housing seasonal island workers serving the late-Spring, Summer, and early-Fall tourist trade.

Secondly, we know that going to Catalina in March or April would create conflicts for some of our participants on certain weekends (i.e., Easter, the Visalia DX Convention, income tax return preparation week, etc.)

Third, we all know the solar cycle is trending downward and HF band conditions probably won't be as good as on recent DXpeditions. With 15 and 10 meters likely to be unusable, that leaves 20 meters as our primary band—and only usable band during daytime hours.

Finally—and maybe the biggest issue, but one we can address—we sense that our antenna footprint at the campground area might need to be reduced. We will be discussing this with campground management in the months ahead but are confident of a successful outcome.

PVARC radio operators are needed for the 2015 Palos Verdes Half Marathon on Saturday, November 14



This year's Palos Verdes Half Marathon follows the same course as last year, with the start/finish at Pelican Cove in Rancho Palos Verdes between the Pt. Vicente Lighthouse and Terranea Resort. There will also be 5K and 10K runs with different color-coded runner bibs keeping participants readily identifiable. RF chip timing mats at three locations including the finish line are slated to provide real-time tracking information via cellular data connections.

But a "sunken" SAG stop site at El Segundo's Recreation Park made for challenging communication with handheld radios there. Operating at Culver City's Ballona Creek Bike Path required a 10' mast with directional antenna to get over Westchester's bluffs into the N6RPV repeater. And at SAG stop 1 along El Segundo's beachfront bike path at Vista de Mar and Grand Avenue our operator Ralph, Al6GP, had to give multiple reports that the restrooms were unexpectedly locked all morning —much to riders' dismay.

Support ARRL efforts for H.R. 1301 to allow reasonable antennas where currently restricted by CC&R's

The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015 -- H.R.1301 -- has been introduced in the US House of Representatives. The measure would direct the FCC to extend its rules relating to reasonable accommodation of Amateur Service communications to private land use restrictions. US Rep Adam Kinzinger (R-IL) introduced the bill on March 4 with 12 original co-sponsors from both sides of the aisle -seven Republicans and five Democrats.

HR 1301 would require the FCC to amend its Part 97 Amateur Service rules to apply the three-part test of the PRB-1 federal pre-emption policy to include homeowners' association regulations and deed restrictions, often referred to as "covenants, conditions, and restrictions" (CC&Rs). At present, PRB-1 only applies to state and local zoning laws and ordinances. The FCC has been reluctant to extend the same legal protections to include such private land-use agreements without direction from Congress. H.R. 1301 has been referred to the House Energy and Commerce Committee. Rep Greg Walden, W7EQI (R-OR), chairs that panel's Communications and Technology Subcommittee, which will consider the measure.
