Our **August 5** meeting presents **PVARC members' 2021 ARRL Field Day operations and results**. Ray Day, N6HE, has assembled a live presentation illustrating what various PVARC members did on Field Day and enabling those members to speak. Some meeting attendees not in the presentation will also have an opportunity to describe their Field Day.

For an analogy of this month's meeting presentation look no further than the popular "ABC's Wide World of Sports" that ran from 1961 to 1998 featuring many different sports in each episode. It always opened with a bombastic announcer promising to bring you "The thrill of victory...and the agony of defeat." On August 5 we'll be extending those outcomes to this year's Field Day.

As reported several months ago, the PVARC Board of Directors decided in March not to operate at Pt. Vicente Lighthouse during International Lighthouse & Lightship Weekend on August 20-21. We felt the possibility of COVID variants had a high likelihood of materializing...and one eventually did.

The PVARC's **September 2** monthly meeting kicks off Labor Day weekend by "**Dealing with RFI.**" As urban EMI/RFI noise floors rise hams will increasingly seek the causes and solutions. We'll also discuss new technical resources the ARRL Los Angeles Section can provide for those experiencing EMI/RFI issues.■

Updates on resuming PVARC in-person meetings

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes contacted us in early July inquiring about September-December 2021 meeting room dates we needed at Hesse Park. However actual room reservations would not be taken until the City's online reservation system re-opened at a later date. We haven't heard further and with the COVID Delta variant spreading there's no new estimate on when Hesse Park's meeting rooms will be accessible.

In a change of plans, our **August 14 HF Enthusiasts Group meeting will not meet at the Palos Verdes Library District main branch's Purcell Room** as previously announced. The August 14 meeting is being held via Webex as have all HFE meetings since April 2020. When the Library gave us the green light in mid-June 2021 to resume in-person meetings it advised then fully-vaccinated individuals need not wear face-coverings. Conditions have worsened such that everyone—vaccinated or not—is currently required to have a face-cover.

In the meantime, we'll continue using Webex for all meetings...and prepare for hybrid meetings to allow attending either virtually or in-person when the latter's time comes. ■

The outdoor W6TRW Swap Meet plans resuming on August 28 at Northrop Grumman Space Park



The W6TRW Radio Club announced in early July its monthly parking lot swap meet at Northrop Grumman's North Redondo Beach complex would be allowed to reopen starting August 28, 2021. Before the coronavirus in March 2020 this swap meet had operated for 42 years on the last Saturday each month except for several months in 2015.

Not known yet are any COVID protocols for upcoming swap meets or other requirements since the Delta variant accelerated later in July 2021.

The W6TRW swap meet functions as a meeting place for many hams in lieu of local hamfests. The ARRL is also usually there spread across several booth spaces in the parking lot's southwest corner. Additionally Volunteer Examiner ham radio license testing sessions are offered at 10 am in the Space Park cafeteria building during each swap meet.

The maxim "No news is good news" surely wasn't intended for amateur radio.


There's <u>always</u> something happening in ham radio whether it's developments in DXing, public service, technology, gatherings, or buying and selling—you will always want amateur radio news.

So where to turn for ham news? The internet is full of information and misinformation but I find several websites excel as primary sources in providing the right stuff—much of which seemingly gets reproduced on other sites.

(Personal disclosure statement: **QRO** Editor AI6DF is also Los Angeles Section Manager for the American Radio Relay League.)

Here are my favorite free sources for ham news (no subscription required):

- The American Radio Relay League website homepage, <u>www.arrl.org</u> (see right), and click "Read All" for more. Additional news for members.

- 3. The DXZone website, https://www.dxzone.com/category/product-news-events-announcement-and-rumors/

Of course, other ham sites excel at providing vast amounts of specific information such as: https://www.qrz.com/ for license lookups (you will need to register with your callsign to use, other benefits available for paid members); eham.net for ham product reviews/ratings; various DX cluster sites showing DX stations heard; and YouTube for endless videos of product reviews or how to do things.



Additional PVARC public service operators needed for Labor Day "Conquer the Bridge" 5.3-mile run/walk in San Pedro



The 12th annual Labor Day (Monday, Sept. 4) "Conquer the Bridge" run/walk across Los Angeles Harbor's Vincent Thomas Bridge again has PVARC radio operators providing communication across the 5.3 mile route.
